Certificate of Merit News

The application process has begun for Certificate of Merit 2018 which will take place March 3 in Stockton for strings, March 10 and 11 at Los Medanos College for piano, and March 11 at LMC for winds. Go to the Students tab at your teacher portal and view your list of students. Then click the blue "apply" button, change the student's school grade and CM level, and click "submit." It's that easy! For students NOT planning to participate this year, just leave them on your list - after the 31st, they will be cleared. Be sure to sign the student up for Senior Award if they are eligible this year. This must be done during the October window.

You have until midnight on Halloween to submit a student application. There can be no late registrations!! The student's name (spelling error), grade, or DOB can be changed after the deadline, but not the level, so double-check every entry before midnight on the 31st.

Once you have submitted the application, it is up to the parent to do his/her part. From the parent's portal, the application for 2018 will appear on their student list. See below for a view of what your student's parents will see. They can update the students address/phone and change school grade by clicking on "Update Student Profile." What the parent must do now is click on the application ID (left column) for the 2018 application. This will bring up the Parent Waiver/Consent form, which s/he must sign. The parent must scroll through all the text before being allowed to enter an electronic signature. The MTAC Programs Media Consent form is there as well. I've attached both documents to this email, in case you wish to see what the parent is agreeing to.

Nothing more now needs to be done until the November 1 - 10 window for the parent to pay the fees. You can, however, begin entering repertoire if you wish, but this is not due until January 15.


