## MUSIC AS WE AGE

I don't know about you, but I seem to be developing musicdementia at the beginning of my old age - not only my mental, but also my physical memory is slipping away! It takes forever to warm up on the flute these days, and to recover all that which I was able to do the day before. This was never the case years ago, with my having been able to go on stage in a pinch without even playing a peep. I think this may be similar to the balance between the organized construction and destruction of brain cells, which goes on constantly in life. With my flute playing, I'm simply losing my ability (as modest as this ability may have been) quicker than my talent lets me grow, or so it seems. This happens despite my inventing new strategies for practicing the flute, with the intended result of attaining and retaining my perceived ability. My flute students seem to absorb rhythms and methods, technique and musicality, and have these abilities even before I can put this in a sentence form! It quite simply takes me a while to get myself to the point of constructive practice, and surely constructive results. And because I don't have all the time I'd like for this, I feel sometimes as though I'm barely treading water. (Can any of you relate to what I'm saying?)

This past fall I prepared and performed a program of flute duo with piano, and also continued to play principal flute in the Diablo Symphony Orchestra. We have a new conductor this year - and the repertoire is extensive and demanding. When I think I have one of the licks down pat, I move on to the next one, and even though I may be happy with the practice results, I find that tomorrow I must once again start on the other side of the universe. Why doesn't this stick anymore? Sometimes I'm not at all confident that I'll be able to render the work anywhere near how I'd like, or even close to how I may have performed it 40 years ago. Oh, my ... I think I have a problem!

As I continue to struggle with the learning curve of aging fingers and mental acuity, and as I also continue to teach whipper-snapper young students who absorb their lessons like a sponge, I can only hope that although my ability may diminish, my appreciation for music and love of teaching stays strong. I continue to perform (although surely not at the level of my college years), but now choose repertoire according to my present ability, and not the ability of my memories. And I find that I encourage myself, just as I encourage my students. I'm exceedingly proud of our Delta Branch Teachers who performed last October on the Teacher Recital, as we brought our level of performance and our love of music to our fellow teachers, our students, and our community. Encouragement of each other is a great thing: the blind can hear it; the deaf can see it; and everyone needs it ... especially each of us ... and most especially me.

### Certificate of Merit

➡ appy New Year! The CM database is open for you to enter your students' repertoire, with a deadline of February 2. Instructions have been emailed, and are also in your branch directory on pages 16 – 17. Since we have two full days of piano evaluations, and I would like to start scheduling soon, please let me know (email is best: catherine@thompsonmusicstudio.com) if you must stick to just Saturday or just Sunday, or if I can schedule you for part-day both days. We will have a full house both days (three piano evaluation rooms plus the testing room) and woodwinds on Sunday as well, so will need teachers to work during the time they have students attending. Happily, we will be able to stay in just the Music area of LMC on both days. Strings will be going to Stockton on Saturday and can take the written part there as well, so will not need to come to LMC at all this year. Check with your students regarding CMEA, Chinese school, or other events that may be happening on Saturday, March 1 so we can schedule them on the 2<sup>nd</sup> instead.

Our honors requirements have changed just a bit this year, so I want to remind you of the requirements:

Honors students must be Level 2 or higher Honors piece must be memorized (piano students only) Only ratings of 5-, 5, or 5+ will be accepted "All Pieces Well Performed" must be a "Yes" Technique: Good or Excellent Sight Reading: Average, Good, or Excellent Theory score: must be 80% or higher

5 minute time limit on the chosen Honors piece

These will be provided to each evaluator, in writing, in advance! For information on what constitutes a "good" or "excellent" on technique and sight reading, check your syllabus – there is a page there explaining what the evaluators must look for to give these ratings (keyboard syllabus pages 16-17).

Don't hesitate to call or email me with any questions or concerns, especially about repertoire. Remember that Romantic and Impressionistic are one category this year, so a Level 3 or higher student cannot play a piece by Schumann and another by Debussy and have them count as different categories. . . ! In fact, here is a list of composers who are now in the "romantic" category, simply because that category now includes "impressionistic:" Albeniz, Czerny, Debussy, Dohnanyi, Faure, Gliere, Joplin, MacDowell, Rebikov, Ravel, Schubert, Schytte, Sibelius. . . you get the picture!

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# **Teen Seminar**

On behalf of the MTAC Delta Branch, Eric and Catherine Thompson will host another Teen Seminar on February 8. These events are open only to teenagers (ages 13 through 19) and are an informal performance opportunity. Teens often have pieces that take longer to prepare, so they get less chances to perform. This is a way for them to "try out" a piece or pieces that may not be completely prepared for a formal recital. Parents and teachers can but do not need to stay (and actually, it's less pressure on the students if the parents do NOT stay!) and students can bring a friend (even a non-musician friend) so they feel more comfortable. Along with the performances, we talk a little about the styles of music, history regarding the composers and time periods, or even just things like how to adjust your bench so you know if it is going up or down! Then we share food and watch a bit of a performance video or musical cartoon for some social time. Students of all studios are invited, and they do not need to be CM students to participate. ## **COMPOSERS TODAY**

**COMPOSERS TODAY (CT)** is an annual MTAC-sponsored program that encourages development of musical composition and improvisation skills. There are three programs of which you should be aware:

1. EVALUATIONS: A non-competitive learning experience where students receive a written response, in the form of constructive comments and ratings, from two professional evaluators. Submissions are now done online using .pdf, .mp3, and .wav files. Compositions from the Evaluations can be submitted for performance in one of several State Convention Symposium recitals based upon the two evaluators' ratings. Teachers may also submit compositions and perform in the Symposium.

Deadlines: Evaluations, January 15, 2014; Symposium, April 15, 2014

2. STATE CONTEST: This competition offers a 1st, 2nd, and 3<sup>rd</sup> place trophy for each of the eight students and teacher divisions based on age as of March 30. First Place winners will receive a monetary award. Two professional adjudicators provide constructive written comments and judge compositions. Winners perform their pieces (or have someone perform them) at the State Convention. Honorable mentions will be listed on the website and their pieces and pictures will be displayed with the 1st, 2nd, and 3rd place winners at the convention. Submissions are now done online using .pdf, .mp3, and .wav files. Deadline: March 30, 2014

3. YOUNG COMPOSERS GUILD: The Guild provides a special format for serious young composers who plan to pursue music composition as a career. Students who have had their work performed at MTAC State Convention at least once during their high school years may apply for membership in the YCG. Students may be selected to perform at convention and by invitation for various branches throughout the state. Deadline: January 15th

#### RACHEL REILLY YOUNG ARTIST COMPETITION Delta Branch, MTAC Saturday, April 5, 2014

Purpose:	The purpose of this competition is to give students audition experience, to give them the benefit of an experienced musician's comments, and to reward excellence.			
Categories:	Category I:       Grades up to and including Grade 8 - \$100 (1 <sup>st</sup> place) & \$50 (2 <sup>nd</sup> place)         Category II:       Grades 9-12 - \$150 (1 <sup>st</sup> place) & \$75 (2 <sup>nd</sup> place)			
Fees:	Each application for any division must be accompanied by a non-refundable fee as follows: Category I - \$10; Category II - \$20. Please make checks payable to MTAC Delta Branch.			
Auditions:	Saturday, April 5, 2014, beginning early morning. Applicants will be notified regarding their specific audition time. No request for special time will be honored.			
Place:	Los Medanos College Music Department Recital Hall.			
Eligibility:	Competition is open to piano, instrumental, and vocal performers who are currently studying with a member of the MTAC, Delta Branch, whose primary membership is with this branch. Students of contributory members are not eligible to compete. Winners may not compete on the same instrument if they have won $I^{m}$ place in the same category in the prior year's competition.			
Judging:	Two adjudicators are selected to hear the auditions. They will select winners for each category and give written comment sheets to each performer. Only one winner will be selected for each designated prize. Prizes will be awarded solely on the basis of their music performance.			
Repertoire:	Category I: 10 minutes maximum; 2 contrasting pieces or movements from larger works, both which <u>must</u> be memorized. Category II: 15 minutes maximum; 2 contrasting pieces or movements from larger works, both which <u>must</u> be memorized. Please note: Students are to perform music from the traditional classical literature.			
Recognition:	Winners will be presented in concert and prizes awarded on <b>April 12</b> , <b>3:00 p.m</b> ., at the LMC Recital Hall. If a 1 <sup>st</sup> place winner is absent, that award will be given to the 2 <sup>nd</sup> place winner.

#### DELTA BRANCH (MTAC) SCHOLARSHIP Guidelines for Applicants

The Music Teachers' Association of California (MTAC) is a California organization incorporated in 1897 for the purpose of establishing excellence in the music teaching profession. The Delta Branch of MTAC, located in the East Bay Area, has been in existence since 1983. We offer private music lessons, instruction in music theory, opportunities for recitals and competitions, as well as the Certificate of Merit individual testing program for overall musical knowledge. We are proud to be able to offer this \$1,200 scholarship to a student majoring in music at LMC. Qualifications

1. Full-time students at LMC, with a declared major in music.

<u>Part-time</u> declared music majors are eligible IF they are carrying 6 or more music units AND can show by transcripts: LMC Fall 2013 and two or more other semesters (from LMC or other college) that their music and general education requirements are on track for transfer.

 Must be entering a 2<sup>nd</sup>, 3<sup>nd</sup> or 4<sup>th</sup> year at LMC in the fall of 2014, with plans to transfer to a four-year college or university upon completion of courses at LMC,

OR must already have acceptance at a four-year college or university for transfer from LMC in the fall of 2014, with a declared major in music.

3. Members of MTAC are ineligible

Letters of recommendation may be mailed with the application form OR, if the faculty members prefer to send confidential recommendations, they may be mailed separately, postmarked no later than April 2, 2014.

Brief statement from the student about his/her goals in music and how the MTAC scholarship would help the applicant pursue those goals.

 Required documents: <u>Full-time</u> music majors: 2013 Fall LMC transcript and a copy of your Spring 2014 class registration.

<u>Part-time</u> music majors: transcripts from Fall 2013 LMC and two or more other semesters (from LMC or other college) demonstrating that your music and general education requirements are on track for transfer. Also, a copy of your Spring 2014 registration showing enrollment in 6 or more music units.

5. If transferring to a four year institution in the fall of 2014, applicant must send verification of acceptance to said college or university and proof that student will be a declared major in music at that school.

Notice of Recipient and Disbursement of Scholarship Money

The winner will be notified no later than April 30, 2014. Award money will be available for the winning student at the college to be attended in Fall, 2014, and may be used for any college-related expense in the fall semester, 2014, including tuition and books.
