## In memoriam: Carol Elaine Hemmah Schmidt

March 1, 1925 - September 2, 2018

Carol Schmidt was so happy to be a part of our Delta Branch! She was a generous volunteer in time of need. She participated in the CM program for at least seven years or so, and she was a staunch supporter of our branch music events. In fact, her family offered donations to our branch be made in lieu of flowers.

Many times I drove written materials/CM resources over to Carol's place. Together we would review the procedures, rules and resources for CM.

Whenever we dialogued, Carol never complained about anything – she was flexible, happy, and a willing team member for our branch endeavors.

On several occasions Carol shared with me the history resources she was compiling regarding her family tree.

A few weeks after Carol's stroke I went to visit her, and at that time she invited me to take whatever music books that would be helpful to me for CM. She knew at that point that she would no longer be able to teach her piano students.

I am personally thankful to Carol for her happy disposition and her kindness that she extended to all who knew her. At Carol's memorial, her sons spoke very specifically about her life-long belief: "If you can't say something nice about someone, don't say anything at all. " What a wonderful philosophy of life! - Kathleen

Eric and I remember Carol by her friendly disposition, her stories of her family tree, and her green Gremlin! Did you know her Norwegian family has ties to the actual Peer Gynt?! In my head I can still hear her voice on my answering machine: "Would you be so kind as to call me back?" Rest in peace, dear, sweet lady! -Catherine and Eric

Welcome to the opening concert of the Diablo Symphony Orchestra's 56th season! On the 100th anniversary of Lili Boulanger's death, this program celebrates the powerful impact that Lili and her sister Nadia had on the musical world, both through Lili's compositions in her short lifetime, and the inspiration of Nadia's teaching of virtually every important twentieth-century composer.

Our concert features compositions by **Lili Boulanger**, as well as works from composers who inspired, or were inspired by the Boulanger sisters: **Gabriel Fauré, Arthur Honegger, Aaron Copland, and Claude Debussy**. We are joined by guest clarinet soloist **Stephen Zielinski**.

Running Sep 28-30 and Oct 5-7 at the California Theatre in Pittsburg, and Oct 13-14 at El Campanil in Antioch. This spoof of the story of King Arthur and his search for the Holy Grail is filled with musical jokes and memorable musical numbers.
